

# Html Extras

Snow Script | Falling images

This assignment is designed to show you that there is more to creating a web page than just simple HTML; there are codes/scripts that can be added to simple HTML coded websites. For example, I have created a web page using the "snow script" found on <http://www.dynamicdrive.com> and I used an image of Chiles High School and set it as the background; this is to be your example.

First, you will create a new folder titled, '**HTML EXTRAS**'. Then inside that new folder (HTML EXTRAS), created another new folder and title it, '**Snow Script**'. Now you will save all work and images inside the 'Snow Script' folder for the snow storm at Chiles High web page.

Take a look at the example page I created and then begin to create your own snow storm at Chiles High web page using the code found at <http://www.dynamicdrive.com/dynamicindex3/snow.htm>. You can use the same background image from the example or another image of Chiles if you so choose but, it must have the dimensions of 1600 wide and 900 height.

Once you have re-created your own snow storm at Chiles web page and it is saved in your OneDrive folder following all the instructions stated above, then you will create another folder inside the 'HTML EXTRAS' folder.

This additional new folder, will be saved in the HTML Extras as well; it will be titled '**Falling Images**' and will contain all work and images associated with web page. Now, you will create another web page similar to the snow storm page. However, this time you will use a different image (not snow.gif) but you will still use the same scripting code (just modify code to reflect the new file name of the new image). See my example title 'Falling Images' for a visual reference.

Once the assignment is completed, to receive full credit, you must upload the entire folder and its contents to the OneDrive folder that I created and shared with you. If you are turning in the assignment after the due date, you will need to email ([karmanosn@leonschools.net](mailto:karmanosn@leonschools.net)) me and request a re-grade of the assignment. All students are eligible for ONLY 1 regrade per assignment, if you fail to turn in your assignment on or before the due date and you receive a zero for the initial grade, you then only have the ability to submit assignment, no re-grade of the re-grade. Your re-grade is your re-submission of past due, or late work. All work submitted 1 week or later, after the due date, is only eligible to receive half credit (no re-grade on work submitted 1 week or later, after the due date). Any work submitted two weeks after due date will not be graded; after two weeks the assignment is closed.
